

## **Key Dates for Possible Trimley St Martin Village Expansion Proposals to be Included on a revised Local Plan**

### **November 2003**

#### **Parish Council responds to Trinity Vision (and any others that might appear by then).**

*Reference to the local concerns will be made at this point and copies of villagers' submissions included.*

### **February 2004**

#### **\*Regional Planning Guidance is published. (This is the replacement for the County Structure Plan)**

*This is the first key date and will be followed by a period of consultation. It should include details of the number of houses needed in our area of Suffolk over the next few years. It will then go on deposit at a later date. Just to make life confusing this will later become known as the Regional Spatial Strategy.*

### **June 2004**

#### **Planning and Compulsory Purchase Bill - Royal Assent**

*This date could still be delayed as it has been previously. It puts the legality of the new planning process in place.*

### **August 2004**

#### **\*Publication of SCDC Draft Local Plan**

*Another key date as the plan goes on deposit for a minimum 6 weeks for representation to be made. Please remember that only those who make representation at this stage can appear at the public enquiry. Subject to Royal Assent of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Bill this will have metamorphosed into the Local Development Document forming part of the Local Development Framework.*

### **Early 2005**

#### **\*Public Enquiry into Plan**

*Another key date and probably the final chance for opinions to be aired. It is anticipated that the inspector will allow up to 1 day on Trimley St Martin bearing in mind there are 118 parishes in the plan area. The parish council as well as others who have made a representation at the deposit stage will have a chance to put forward their views to the inspector at this point.*

### **Late 2005**

#### **Inspector publishes his findings.**

*This signals the full incorporation of the new plan and lasts for the next three years at least. This is the earliest date that any part of the Trinity (or anybody else's) vision could be formally included.*

*Finally it is worth remembering that:*

- 1. Trinity College may change their vision subject to the content of the Regional Planning Guidance.*
- 2. If no part of their or anybody else's vision is included in the Local Development Document it would be after 2006 before it might re-appear again.*
